



2023 NCAGT Outstanding Administrator of the Gifted Award

Note: Each school district is eligible to nominate one candidate from its system for the NCAGT Outstanding Administrator of the Gifted Award.

Criteria

All nominees must:

- Be an administrator in North Carolina (Administrator could be a principal, Coordinator of the Gifted, Director of Exceptional Children's programs, Supervisor, or Superintendent.)
- Have been an advocate and leader in support of gifted children/youth.
- Exhibit outstanding qualities related to gifted education in the areas of teaching, curriculum development and adaptation, working with gifted children/youth, working with parents, participating in PAGE activities where applicable, and/or dealing with other staff and administrators.
- Exhibit a strong commitment to gifted education through professional experiences, organizations, and services in the area of education for the gifted (i.e. staff development opportunities for school staff, system, or region; help with special funding of programs, etc.)
- Not have been a previous winner of the NCAGT Outstanding Administrator of the Gifted Award

Participating school districts will be notified of the finalists in mid-January of 2023 and the NCAGT Outstanding Administrator of the Gifted Finalists will be recognized at a special event during the annual NCAGT Conference in Winston-Salem.
