

2024 Outstanding Teacher of the Gifted Award

Note: Each school district is eligible to nominate one candidate from its system for the NCAGT Outstanding Teacher of the Gifted Award.

Criteria

All nominees must:

- Be certified by the State of North Carolina to teach gifted students.
- Have taught gifted children/youth for at least three years.
- Be teaching gifted children/youth during the current school year. (This may include regular classroom teachers, consultation teachers, or AIG teachers.)
- Exhibit outstanding qualities related to gifted education in the areas of teaching, curriculum development and adaptation, working with gifted children/youth, working with parents, participating in PAGE activities where applicable, and/or dealing with other staff and administrators.
- Exhibit a strong commitment to gifted education through professional experiences, professional organizations, and/or services in the area of education for the gifted.
- Be a current member of NCAGT (may renew or join if necessary).
- May not have been a previous state level winner of NCAGT's Outstanding Teacher of the Gifted Award.

Participating school districts will be notified of the finalists in mid-January of 2024 and the NCAGT Outstanding Teacher of the Gifted Finalists will be recognized at a special event during the annual NCAGT Conference in Winston-Salem. The recipient of the Outstanding Teacher of the Gifted award will receive a plaque of recognition.
